Lara Keir: This January I had the opportunity to attend World Youth Day in Panama City. Prior to World Youth Day week, we spent a week in Mexico where we had the opportunity to see a number of religious and non-religious sites. In Mexico, we visited a number of awe-inspiring churches one being the church of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of Mexico. Our Lady of Guadalupe also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe is an image of Mary held in the minor basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The image itself is quite remarkable and has been involved in a number of accidents, such as a spill of cleaning acid, which should have destroyed it but there are no signs of damage or ageing. In Mexico, we also had the opportunity to climb the ruins of the Aztec temples, taste fried crickets and visit the national museum of anthropology. We then travelled to Panama for World Youth Day week. The atmosphere of World Youth Day week was incredible. We spent our time in Panama meeting people from all over the world despite language barriers, enjoying concerts even when we didn't understand a word that was said and attending masses leads by the Pope. Listening to the Pope was extremely inspiring. His main message throughout World Youth Day was encouraging the youth of the world to take action now not later. He encouraged us to stand up for what we believe in and to say yes to God no matter how difficult it may seem at the time. After World Youth Day week we spent 2 nights in a resort in Panama for our retreat. This retreat featured large sessions with all the other bus groups lead by Steve Angrisano and smaller sessions with just our bus group. We spent time reflecting on what we had seen, done and experienced during our time away in these sessions and we had a lot of free time which we spent by the pool. I would like to thank the parish community for their prayers and well wishes for this trip.
