On July 14, 1789 France changed dramatically. On that date, the French Revolution begun when the middle and lower class citizens of Paris stormed the Bastille and burned to the ground. For the revolution, the Bastille is a symbol for the beginning of change and the start of a new beginning for the classes that have been oppressed by the aristocracy in the centuries before. Unlike the American Revolution (1775–83), which was fought to conserve rights and maintain political order, the French Revolution destroyed the fabric of French society. No aspect of human life was untouched. The Committee of Public Safety – influenced by Rousseau – claimed that to convert the oppressed French nation to democracy, "you must entirely refashion a people whom you wish to make free, destroy its' prejudices, alter its habits, limit its necessities, root up its vices, purify its desires." To achieve this end, the new rational state, whose primary ideological plank was that the sovereignty of "the people" is unlimited, attempted to eliminate French traditions, "Liberty, Equality, Fraternity".

On July 20, 1969, as Neil Armstrong took a historic first step onto the dusty, desolate surface of the Moon, there was great excitement and joy back in Houston, Texas and all around the world as millions watched and listened to this amazing event.
