Brisbane Archbishop, Mark Coleridge, presented a hope-filling and rejuvenating message for the coming **2020 Australian Plenary Council**. In the foreword to book **Saving Catholics: A Workbook for Reform and Renewal in the Catholic Church** by Dr. Gideon Goosen, Archbishop offers some hope that this **Plenary Council** might go some way to restore a bit of morale in the institution. The new book is a **Workbook for Reform and Renewal in the Catholic Church** produced especially to encourage input from all people who claim an association with the Church over the next two years leading up to this **Council**. In Australia and elsewhere, the Catholic Church is facing challenges so large and complex that it's not unreasonable to speak of this as a time of crisis. There's no need to panic, but there is a need to assess the current situation realistically and hopefully – and to plan for the future on the basis of that assessment, trusting that the **Holy Spirit** is at work in what seems to be the mess and will lead the Church into a future of **God's making**. It was that sense which led the Australian Bishops in 2016 to decide to move towards a **Plenary Council**—the fifth in Australia, the last being in 1937. The journey towards the Council has already begun and it includes three phases; preparation, celebration and implementation. At the heart of the preparation phase, there is a process of consultation, in which the bishops hope to hear as many of the voices in the Church as possible. Sometimes people think the Catholic Church is monolithic, but that's far from the truth. The Church is a very large and diverse community of faith in which there are different levels of participation, different ways of seeking **God** and different voices in the chorus. What binds them together is that they put their faith in **Jesus Christ crucified and risen**, recognizing that in the end he is all the Church has. Without him, all that's left is ideology which would leave the Church a corpse, not **the Body of Christ**. Among the many voices, the voice of **Gideon Goosen** speaks from the pages of this book. His is a voice of faith, but also the voice of a man with long experience of Church life and theological education in this country. My hope is that what he offers here will encourage the kind of listening and reflection which will have to be at the heart of the process of consultation required by the **Plenary Council**. The book he has written is solidly grounded and practical; it is theologically alert but accessible; it could be read by individuals and used by groups; it is brief and yet comprehensive in canvassing the issues, needs and possibilities. But it is not only the voice of **Gideon Goosen** we hear in these pages. He draws from many sources— notably **Pope Francis** but also other voices from Australia and beyond, some of them belonging to well-known figures in the Church but others to ordinary people who are less well known but through whom the **Holy Spirit** can also speak. In that sense, the book is symphonic.
