**The following three truths support**

**Resurrection of Christ:** **1.** The tomb in which Jesus was buried was discovered empty by a group of women on the Sunday following the crucifixion. **2.** Jesus' disciples had real experiences with one whom they believed was the risen Christ. **3.** As a result of the preaching of these disciples, which had the Resurrection at its center, the Christian church was established and grew.

Jesus is the only religious leader who has risen from the dead. All other religious leaders are still in their tombs. Who would you believe? I think the answer is clear: Jesus' resurrection demonstrates that what He said was true. Therefore, we must accept his statement to be the only way to God: "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, except through me" (John 14:6). The resurrection proves that those who trust in Christ will not be subject in eternity to a half-human existence in just their souls. It proves that our bodies will be resurrected one day. Because of the resurrection of Christ, believers will one day experience, forever, the freedom of having a glorified soul and body.
