A Message from the Archdiocese of Sydney: Child sexual abuse is a crime. The appropriate people to deal with crimes are the police. If you, or anyone you know, have been abused, please contact the police. You may also want to speak to your Parish Priest who will be able to provide support and guidance. The Archdiocese has a legal obligation to report crimes to the police.

New Evangelisation: The term was first used by Pope Paul VI in his 1975 apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii nuntiandi*, which itself built upon documents from the Second Vatican Council including *Lumen gentium*, *Ad gentes*, *Gaudium et spes*, and *Dignitatis humanae*. The term was popularized by Pope John Paul II who first used it during an address to the Latin American bishops in Port-au-Prince, Haiti on May 9, 1983. He declared that the fifth centenary of the first evangelization of the Americas (1492–1992) should mark the beginning of a new era of evangelization, "evangelization will gain its full energy if it is a commitment, not to re-evangelize but to a New Evangelization, new in its ardor, methods and expression". Pope John Paul II then expounded on the idea later, including his encyclical, *Redemptoris missio*, a *Magna Carta* of the new evangelization, his apostolic letter, *Tertio millennio adveniente*, issued for the Great Jubilee of the year 2000 and his apostolic exhortation, *Novo millennio ineunte*. In *Redemptoris missio*, he wrote: 'I sense that the moment has come to commit all of the Church's energies to a new evangelization and to the mission *ad gentes*. No believer in Christ, no institution of the Church can avoid this supreme duty: to proclaim Christ to all peoples.'^[9] In 2010, Pope Benedict XVI established the Pontifical Council for Promoting the New Evangelization.^[3] When he called for a Year of Faith^[10] from 2012 to 2013 on the 50th anniversary of the Second Vatican Council, he opened it with a general assembly of the Synod of Bishops on The New Evangelization for the Transmission of the Christian Faith.^[4] On June 29, 2013, Pope Francis released a related apostolic exhortation *Evangelii gaudium* (English: The Joy of the Gospel) on "the church's primary mission of evangelization in the modern world".^[11] As of April 2019, Pope Francis was reported to be planning a reorganization of the Curia that will make evangelization its principal focus. A final draft of his apostolic constitution on the Roman Curia, titled *Praedicate Evangelium* ("Preach the Gospel"), has been submitted for comment to national bishops' conferences and a variety of other bodies.

Cardinal John Henry Newman looked to faithful Catholic education for the repair of the human person, which had been disintegrated by original sin. In his fascinating 1856 sermon at the University Church in Dublin, Newman lamented that we tend to focus on knowledge to the exclusion of morality – or conversely, on morality without regard for sound reasoning. Each person's soul is subject to conflicting appeals of intellect, conscience, passion, and appetite, all "warring in his own breast" and each trying "to get possession of him." On 13th October Cardinal Newman will be canonized by Pope Francis at the special Holy Mass.

Please dedicate a Bible or Catholic Catechism to our church. The books with dedications will remain in our church on the pews. Single dedication requires \$15. \$5 will be collected for the potential WYD Pilgrims going to Portugal. We have already 35 Bibles and 9 Catholic Catechisms in our pews. They have to be available for us coming to the church.
