

The early Church Fathers like St. Justin Martyr (d. 165), said, “We Christians are the true Israel which springs from Christ, for we are carved out of His heart as from a rock.”, and St. Irenaeus of Lyons (d. 202) said, “The Church is the fountain of the living water that flows to us from the Heart of Christ”. Although these are just two brief examples from the times of the early Church, we find a profound respect for the Sacred Heart. The devotion continued to grow during the Middle Ages, and in 1353 Pope Innocent VI instituted a Mass honoring the mystery of the Sacred Heart. The devotion escalated due to the fervor surrounding the apparitions of our Lord to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-90). The four apparitions provided the catalyst for the promotion of the devotion to the Sacred Heart: a feast day in honor of the Sacred Heart, and the offering of our Lord's saving grace and friendship if the individual attended Mass and received Holy Communion on nine consecutive first Fridays of the month. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII consecrated the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Since then, his successors have exhorted the faithful to turn to the Sacred Heart and make acts of personal consecration. Pope Pius XII's beautiful encyclical on the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, *Haurietis Aquas* (1956), states, “[Jesus] has loved us all with a human heart.

Euthanasia...? “...Every place that has gone down the euthanasia path has left the frail, elderly, sick and disabled with fewer options, not more; with less care, not more. It also has encouraged other classes of non-terminal sufferers to consider a state sanctioned death. Despite the culture of the quick fix, despite demands for governments or health professionals to make everything nice, some suffering is unfixable. Then our resilience, our character and our hope are really tested. Then our community's resolve to stand with us, to invest itself in us, not only financially and pharmaceutically but also emotionally and spiritually, is tested. After a weeklong retreat near Rome, the group of 38 bishops of Australia who include diocesan bishops, auxiliary bishops, and the head of the ordinariate for former Anglicans and a diocesan administrator, began their "ad limina" visits to the Vatican with Mass June 24 at the tomb of St. Peter and a long meeting with Pope Francis.
