Pope Francis has requested Catholic communities worldwide to join him in commemorating St Bakhita's Day on 8 Feb 2019, the Catholic Anti-Slavery Day. St Josephine Bakhita, also known as 'Mother Moretta' (our Black Mother) bore 144 physical scars throughout her life which were received after she was kidnapped at the age of nine and sold into slavery. Such was the trauma experienced that she forgot her birth name and her kidnappers gave her the name Bakhita meaning 'fortunate'. She experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. In 1882 her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul. With Italian families Bakhita received kindness, respect, peace and joy. A change in the family's circumstances meant that she was entrusted to the Canossian Sisters of the Institute of the Catechumens in Venice. It was there that Bakhita came to know about God whom, 'she had experienced in her heart without knowing who He was' since she was a child. She was received into the Church in 1890, joining the sisters and making final profession in 1896. Surrounded by the sisters, she died on 8 Feb. 1947.

On this Catechists' Sunday we express our gratitude to all our Catechists for their dedicated presence in the Public Schools. No matter of inconveniences you are there to explain how God is good to us. In particular we wish to acknowledge and present to Albert Dodge a certificate for 10 years of service as a Parish Catechist to students of the Public School.



Special Religious Education is the time set aside in the Public Schools for Catholic SRE Teachers from the local Church to teach children about building a relationship with Jesus and understanding His message of Salvation. SRE is mandated by the Education Act (1990) and gives parents the choice to have children formed in the faith of their family. Catholic SRE Teachers are volunteers who are approved and trained by the Church. SRE Catechists then are authorized to teach in the classroom upholding firmly curriculum whose outlines are publicly available.



Modern Slavery Background

There are an estimated 40 million victims of modern slavery worldwide. Modern slavery now ranks as the second most profitable worldwide criminal enterprise. It is a serious crime which exploits people and can take many forms including: forced labour, sexual exploitation, domestic servitude, forced criminality and organ harvesting. It is believed that modern slavery affects every country in the world and here in Australia there are an estimated 15,000 victims in farms, restaurants, construction sites, factories, beauty salons and hand car washes and many seemingly ordinary places. The eradication of modern slavery and the pastoral care of victims is a priority for the Catholic Church. Pope Francis firmly believes that this battle will be won and slavery will be eradicated in this generation. The Holy Father continually draws the attention of the Church and the wider world to the moral and human crisis evident in this terrible and pervasive exploitation. "I have stated several times that these new forms of slavery – human trafficking, forced labour, prostitution, organ trade – are very serious crimes, a wound on the body of contemporary humanity. The whole of society is called to grow in this awareness, especially with regard to national and international legislation, in order to prosecute the traffickers and redirect their unjust gains to the rehabilitation of victims." *Pope Francis to Participants in the Plenary Session, Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences Saturday, 18 April 2015.*

His fame spread throughout the entire Church in the Middle Ages because he was reputed to have miraculously cured a little boy who nearly died because of a fishbone in his throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat.
