The Pope's a motu proprio entitled <i>Traditionis custodes</i>, made sweeping changes to his predecessor Benedict XVI's 2007 apostolic letter <i>Summorum Pontificum</i>, which approved the right of all priests to say Mass using the Roman Missal of 1962, which is in Latin.</p>	<p>NSW is on the brink of another debate on euthanasia and assisted suicide, with MP Alex Greenwich making moves to introduce legislation into parliament.
